Definition: Multidisciplinary Studies enables students to design a program tailored to the demands of a number of careers and graduate programs. MDS majors work with a Student Success Counselor to combine at least two areas of emphasis from the following: Arts, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Computer science, Criminal Justice, Digital Communications, Human Performance, Philosophy and Psychology. MDS students develop core competencies and the specialized knowledge and skills related to each of their chosen emphases, culminating in a senior research project or career-related experiences.
